
ARRL News: New England Division Cabinet Meeting By Bill Poulin. WZ1L



I devoted one of the January Friends zoom talks to showing off all the amazing features on the SKCC web site. Let's take a closer look in this month's column too.

Straight Key Century Club (SKCC).

I have been an SKCC member for ten years but until recently too busy to really enjoy all it has to offer. SKCC is one of the most successful and fun CW clubs in existence. But what if you find using a straight key difficult and think you can't join in the fun because you use a paddle and keyer? Well, there is a personal exemption (on the honor system) you may claim in that case and still participate.

Here is what ARRL has to say about the SKCC

SKCC was founded in 2006 to promote and preserve the art of manual keying. The idea caught on quickly, and membership has continued to grow to include members in Europe, Oceania, and Asia, as well as the US. SKCC members can earn various awards and participate in sprints using manual devices such as straight keys, bugs, and sideswipers. How to join SKCC

Joining SKCC is very easy and there are no membership dues. To join just visit the SKCC website: https://www.skccgroup.com/ . Then click on the join SKCC tab on that page.

Awards

After joining, you can print out an attractive membership certificate to hang on your wall. But then the real Awards chase begins. SKCC offers lots of wonderful awards for your on-air success.

- Centurion Award: work 100 SKCC members
- Tribune Award: Work 50 different SKCC Centurions, Tribunes, or Senators.
- Senator Award: Another award for working members
- There are awards for QRP, Worked all States, Rag chewing and DXing too. See web site.

K3Y Special Event:

During January, I thoroughly enjoyed working the K3Y Special Event. Each January, stations all around the USA get on and sign K3Y from each call area using the K3Y/area special call signs. Similarly, around the world many stations operate using special event call signs too from Europe, Asia, Africa, South America, and the Pacific. As this year's event has just concluded on January 31, I was amazed at the huge amount of activity and I can not wait from January to come again in 2023 – but in the interim I look forward every month now to the SKCC WES.

The SKCC Weekend Sprintathon (SKCC WES)

The SKCC WES aims to bring together operators with different skill levels in a regularly scheduled, informal operating event lasting 36 hours. The event starts at 1200 UTC on the Saturday following the 6th of each month and ends at 2359 UTC on Sunday. Participants can operate for the full 36 hours. Here are the next two events:

- 12:00 UTC February 12 through 23:59 February 13.
- 12:00 UTC March 12 through 23:59 UTC March 13

Suggested frequencies are on or around the SKCC calling frequencies: 1.813.5, 3.550, 7.038, 7.055 and 7.120, 14.050, 21.050 and 21.114, 28.050 and 28.114, and 50.090 MHz

Listen on the suggested calling frequencies on WES weekends for stations calling "CQ WES" there is always lots of activity.

SKCC has really taken this event to a very impressive level. During a recent CW Friends meeting we spent close to an hour looking at their amazing website!

SKCC is an exceptional club, extraordinarily well run, with lots of activity and friendly operators just waiting to have QSOs with other like-minded amateurs. There is no lack of activity every day from SKCC operators. I am really enjoying my time exploring all the many fun activities and in particular the seeming endless energy of its members. Well, that's it for now. I need to get on the air and work more SKCC members to earn my Tribune Status. CQ WES and CQ SKCC can be heard often from this fun group.

Is your Email address on the FCC site up to date? § 97.23 Mailing and email addresses.

Each license grant must show the grantee's correct name, mailing address, and email address. The email address must be an address where the grantee can receive electronic correspondence. Revocation of the station license or suspension of the operator license may result when correspondence from the FCC is returned as undeliverable because the grantee failed to provide the correct email address. [85 FR 85533, Dec. 29, 2020]

I recommend that you log on to the your FCC Registration at <u>https://apps.fcc.gov/coresWeb/updateRegistrationPre.do</u> to make sure that your email address is up to date. Also in the future should you change your home address or your email address be sure to remember to update it on the FCC site.

Making ZOOM available to Elmers


