#### Next BARS Meeting: April 5 at 7:00 PM -Program: "Antennas - the Third Dimension"

#### Presenter: Gary Sutcliffe, W9XT

Our guest speaker for the Club Meeting (In person and hybrid, hopefully!) on April 5, 2023 will be Gary Sutcliffe, W9XT, and he will give a presentation entitled "Antennas - The Third Dimension". Gary was Licensed as WN9FRG in 1970. Other calls he has held: WB9FRG, WB9FRG/6W8, W0XT. He also has an FCC General Radiotelephone Operator License (Commercial). His main radio interests include contesting, especially CW DX contests, DXing where he has avhieved number one on the DXCC Honor Roll, 5BDXCC, over 100 countries confirmed on each band 160-10M (except 60M), and experimenting, designing and building equipment and antennas, so he is well versed in what makes a great antenna system for your QTH.

Gary got interested in ham radio through his uncle, Harold Beckman (SK) W9HEK, later W9FJ, at an early age but it was not until he got to high school that he had the discipline to learn the code. Gary's dad (Chuck) and Gary got licensed together and Gary was WN9FRG and his Dad was WN9FRF, later W9FRF (SK).

A few years later he attended the University of Wisconsin where he majored in Ham Radio with a minor in Electrical Engineering (HI). The UW club station, W9YT, was a major contest station at the time and he developed a passion for contesting under the guidance of some very good operators.

"My QTH is near Slinger Wisconsin on 14 acres in the country. I wanted to have space for antennas! I currently have 3 towers. Two are for HF and one for 2M EME. I also have other antennas including Beverages, a K9AY array, a 30M vertical and a 160M inverted L."

On Friday, March 24, 12 individuals showed up for the trip to the American Radio Relay League (ARRL) in Newington, CT. The travel is about 133 miles through Routes 495, 290, CT-84 and CT-15. We left at 9:30 and arrived around 11:30am

Upon arrival we ventured into the ARRL HQ building and I talked to the Receptionist and we explained we were from the Billerica Amateur Radio Society and wondered if we could get a tour of the facility. A phone call was made and Maria Somma, AB1FM, ARRL VEC Manager, escorted us to the hallway where there is a historical display of Amateur Radio History from the beginning to present day.

You may not know this, but the ARRL HQ has a separate station, W1HQ, that can be remotely operated by the ARRL Staff. They have their own Radio Club and employees that are licensed can use that station via their cell phone or tablet from their office remotely over the Internet. (Two weeks ago when I visited

W1AW, I was working 40 meters when this loud station attempted to contact me. We chatted for a few minutes and the next thing I knew, he was standing next to me and I heard my reply on his cell phone!)

Back to the Lobby and for some attendees went to purchase License Manuals, Books, Posters, Shirts, Frequency Charts and Free copies of QST and On The Air Magazines, while others strolled over to the display area to see vintage ham radio transceivers, receivers, power supplies, etc.

Our next stop was the Hiram Percy Maxim W1AW Station, We took pictures on the front steps before entering the building, We signed in the log upon entering the building. We were allowed to operate W1AW on various bands, 20, 40, CW on 30, 12 and 10 Meters.

Before leaving, we even purchased some food for Gary, W1GFF who could not make the trip.





#### Feature Article: Running FT8 Without The Internet By Scott Ginsburg, K10A

One Friday afternoon in January a tree fell on my property and took out my Comcast feedline, and with it my Internet. I immediately called Comcast and opened a service ticket. The customer service representative assured me I was on the high priority response list for the following day, Saturday. This put a potential wrinkle in my DXing plans for the weekend as I was still in need of 17m, 12m and 10m contacts with FT8WW on Crozet Island, and the DXpedition operator on Crozet liked to work FT8. I was lucky enough to work him on 20 CW (my #338 on CW), and 30m and 15m FT8, and I was hoping to have a shot at my remaining band fills for the bands he was planning to be active on during his remaining days on this very rare island.

As any of you FT8 operators know, the system clock on your computer needs to be within 2 seconds of current time for the mode to work properly, and as such everyone runs some kind of time management software that queries time servers on the Internet and continually corrects your computer's clock. Without Internet access I would not be able to get my shack computer's system clock synchronized using a program called Dimension 4 which continually runs in the background syncing my clock. Or so I thought!

After doing some quick research on the web I discovered the time command available from the Windows 10 DOS command. This command allows you to reset your system clock using the format HH:MM:SS. Now all I needed was a reliable time source down to the second, and for that I loaded the website <u>http://time.is</u> on my cell phone using my cellular data. I verified that my cell phone time was accurate. You should see output that looks like this:



Then I followed these steps:

- Type cmd into the Windows 10 search window this should display the Command Prompt app.
- Right click on Command Prompt and choose Run as administrator – if you don't run as admin you won't be able to set your clock.
- 3. At the prompt, run the time command it will output what it thinks is the current time, then prompt you for a new time.

- Enter a value that is in the future from what time.is is displaying on your cell phone, for example 30 seconds from now, or the next round minute.
- 5. Get ready to hit the Enter key and when the time you see on time.is matches what you entered, hit the enter key.

Believe it or not, this was enough to get my system clock synchronized. I tested it out by making a few FT8 contacts and was satisfied that it was working. As luck would have it, within an hour or so after setting my clock I worked FT8WW on 12m FT8, and 3 hours later worked him again on 17m FT8 for two more band fills!

#### New Date for NEAR-FestXXXIII

#### FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE

NEAR-FestXXXIII will be held on April 28th and 29th 2023 and not on its traditional date which always has been the first weekend in May every year since 2007. NEAR-Fest XXXIV scheduled for October 13th and 14th 2023 is NOT affected.

Last month the Deerfield Fair Association informed me that they booked two events, the NH Farm, Forest and Garden Show and the NH Arabian Horse Ass'n Show at the Fairgrounds for May  $5^{\text{th}}$  and 6th 2023 which is the weekend before Mothers Day. We were told we were welcome to hold the NEAR-Fest at the same time with the two other shows but there would be a "few small changes" to the parts of the Fairgrounds that we would be allowed to use.



Regretfully I decided the best course of action is to take a chance on the weather one week earlier and change the date. My team agrees with me. It's the best way to deal with it. We have full use of the grounds with no stinking and noisy horses and outsiders to bother us. I resisted it at first but changed my mind after discussing it with my colleagues who run the fester with me. Is this a one-time thing or is it permanent? Depends on if the horse show comes back next spring. We could co-exist with the Farm Show but it is the horse show that causes us the problems because we use part of the grounds adjacent to the Horse Show ring and bleachers.

I still don't like it but I know it is the right decision. We apologize for any inconvenience that this may cause anyone.

### Becoming an ARRL member or is your membership up for renewal?

One of the benefits of being an ARRL Affiliated Club is a commission for recruiting new ARRL members and securing timely ARRL member renewals.

Each new ARRL member earns the club a \$15.00 commission. New members are defined as never having been a member or a returning member that has not been a member for two years. Each renewal earns the club a \$5.00 commission. There is no limit to the amount a club can earn in this program.

Multiyear memberships earn only one commission. Life, Family, International, Blind, and Student memberships are not eligible for a commission. The member will not be eligible to receive a gift or incentive if the club collects a commission on the membership.

Currently at least 82 BARS members are also ARRL members. If we all renewed through the club we could potentiality receive \$410 per year from the ARRL.

#### Is your Email address on the FCC site up to date? § 97.23 Mailing and email addresses.

Each license grant must show the grantee's correct name, mailing address, and email address. The email address must be an address where the grantee can receive electronic correspondence. Revocation of the station license or suspension of the operator license may result when correspondence from the FCC is returned as undeliverable because the grantee failed to provide the correct email address. [85 FR 85533, Dec. 29, 2020]

I recommend that you log on to the your FCC Registration at <u>https://apps.fcc.gov/coresWeb/updateRegistrationPre.do</u> to make sure that your email address is up to date. Also in the future

should you change your home address or your email address be sure to remember to update it on the FCC site.

[The \$35 FCC application fee applies to new, renewal, rule waiver, and modification applications that request a new vanity call sign. The fee will be per application.

Administrative updates, such as a change of name, mailing or email address, and modification applications to upgrade an amateur radio licensee's operator class or to request a sequentially issued call sign, are exempt from fees. - ed.]

#### Making ZOOM available to Elmers


