A Message from the President By Doug Bruce, N1WRN

Greetings of the Season Fellow Members,

I hope that everyone is having a wonderful Holiday season and looking forward to a great 2024!

I was thinking the other day about the message Rick Roderick K5UR had for our Club when he spoke to us. The message was "Who Will Take Over From Here" and he was entirely correct. Our great hobby became great because of the generations of hams who JANUARY 2024

cared enough to make the sacrifices that were necessary to instill knowledge in the next generations of hams.

The hams of the 40's 50's and 60's had a much harder path to get their licenses than this generation had. They had to learn the code and perform under the pressure of an examiner from the FCC in at the Custom House FCC Office in Boston, or in other major cities across the United States. Now if that isn't pressure I don't know what is.

Did that make those older hams better operators? Most definitely. These days we can study in the comfort of our own home and take the test (with no code requirement) in a suburban, relaxed environment of our local Club. It is up to our generation to learn and emulate these hams, because it will make us better hams as well.

Years ago, hams did not have the mode options that we have today to earn the WAS (Worked All States) and DXCC awards. They had to do it using primarily using SSB phone and CW. It took much longer to get these prestigious awards back then. However, these awards are not to be diminished in significance using the modes of today such as FT8. The hams of today still need the operating skills that can be passed on from experienced Elmers to use these newer modes to achieve the awards. It may take a shorter period of time, but the ARRL understands the need to recognize the newer modes as valid contacts for the awards.

This understanding and flexibility by the League will pay dividends in the future. It is up to my generation of hams to really think about what kind of legacy we want to pass to the next generation of hams. My Elmer has spent countless Saturday mornings with me here in the shack because he cares about me and my development as a ham. I gave him the Elmer Award from the ARRL and he was quite emotional as I handed it to him. This generation of hams needs to be aware that the torch needs to be passed and the sooner this generation of hams gets a grasp on the "Who Will Take Over From Here" concept the sooner our successors will be able to show the need enthusiasm to the next generation of hams. I have talked here just now in generalities and a theoretical approach. It is up to all of us to spend those Saturday afternoons with the new hams, answer their questions and teach them to be good operators so that our great hobby will continue well into the future.

On another note, in the Get On The Air Spirit of our Club, there have been some great openings on 10 meters lately. I worked stations in the Falkland Islands and Reunion Island today as a matter of fact. 10 and 12 meters will be the first bands to go away on the downturn of this Solar cycle, go get on the air and take advantage of these opportunities for great contacts!,



Feature Article: A License or Upgrade How-To By Bill Poulin, WZ1L

I have been hearing some conversations on the repeaters about upgrading their amateur radio licensing.

I thought I would give some info and suggestions for those desiring to pursue either an Initial or Upgrade:

EXTRA CLASS

An Extra Class will be held online Beginning Tuesday January 9, 2024 between 6:30-8:30pm for 16 weeks (April30,2024). The class uses the current ARRL Extra Class License Manual 12th Edition (\$32.95 @ HRO). Class website: <u>youtube.com/w4eey</u>

The calculator used in class is a Texas Instrument TI-36X Pro (\$22.00 @ Walmart).

Email Gary Wise <u>w4eey@arrl.net</u> to sign up. Class is **free**.

GENERAL CLASS

(There is a new question pool as of JULY 1, 2023.)

Currently on <u>https://youtube.com/w4eey</u> a General Class which began back on September 5th is recorded. (Videos are available 24/7.)

The class uses the ARRL General Class License Manual 10th Edition (HRO \$32.95) The class runs for 10 weeks. Videos are 2 hours long.

Basically, read Chapter 1, then continue reading a chapter and watching the corresponding video. The calculator used in class is Texas Instrument TI-36X Pro (\$22.00 at Walmart)

NEW TECHNICIAN

(New for 2024)

A New Technician Class will begin on Wednesday, January 10, 2024, from 6:30-8:30pm for 10 weeks. The class uses the current ARRL Technician Class License Manual 5th Edition (available from HRO \$32.95). The class videos are recorded and available 24/7 if you miss the class. <u>https://youtube.com/w4eey0-p00jh</u>

The class begins by reading Chapter 1, then tune in to the first class. Basically, it is a process of reading the chapter and watching the corresponding class video for that chapter. The calculator used is the Texas Instrument TI-36X PRO (\$22.00 at Walmart)

To sign up for the class send Gary Wise an email w4eey@arrl.net

When you have completed the course, I suggest you log on to <u>https://hamstudy.org/</u> and click on your prospective level of study and instead of taking practice exams and select "Study Mode" option to challenge the questions.

Technician question pool has 411 Questions, the General has 427 Questions, and the Extra has 564 Questions.

You will see a question with 4 possible answers. Select what you believe is the correct answer. If you are right the response text turns green and test moves on to the next question.

If you select incorrectly, the text displays in red, and you can select "Show Correct Answer" at the bottom, and the proper answer will be shown.

If you are still unsure, click the right top corner of the Question Box and you will be provided a narrative explanation including the correct answer contained therein.

You will again see the questions you answered incorrectly later for an additional chance to respond correctly.

Make sure you see ALL the Questions in the Question Pool.

A proficiency of 85-90% minimal is suggested before taking your prospective license exam.

Through a determined subject matrix, the individual license class Question Pool dribbles down to a 35 Question Exam for Technician and General Class, and for Amateur Extra, a 50 Question Exam.

The Electronics of Radio Marla Wallace, WA1GSF

Question: What is the function of the capacitor that I often see across the emitter, source, or cathode resistor in an amplifier stage?

Answer: When there is a resistor in the emitter, source, or cathode circuit, it is to establish a bias point for the base, gate, or control grid (respectively) by making the emitter, source, or cathode positive with respect to ground.

But it does this because the transistor or tube conducts current. If the circuit is amplifying an AC signal, that amplified signal becomes superimposed on the DC voltage across the resistor. The effect of this is to create negative feedback, reducing the gain of the circuit. By having a sufficiently large capacitor across the resistor, the AC signal is eliminated, and the circuit gain is thus maximized.

Becoming an ARRL member or is your membership up for renewal?

One of the benefits of being an ARRL Affiliated Club is a commission for recruiting new ARRL members and securing timely ARRL member renewals.

Each new ARRL member earns the club a \$15.00 commission. New members are defined as never having been a member or a returning member that has not been a member for two years. Each renewal earns the club a \$5.00 commission. There is no limit to the amount a club can earn in this program.

Multiyear memberships earn only one commission. Life, Family, International, Blind, and Student memberships are not eligible for a commission. The member will not be eligible to receive a gift or incentive if the club collects a commission on the membership.

Currently at least 82 BARS members are also ARRL members. If we all renewed through the club, we could potentiality receive \$410 per year from the ARRL.

Is your Email address on the FCC site up to date? § 97.23 Mailing and email addresses.

Each license grant must show the grantee's correct name, mailing address, and email address. The email address must be an address where the grantee can receive electronic correspondence. Revocation of the station license or suspension of the operator license may result when correspondence from the FCC is returned as undeliverable because the grantee failed to provide the correct email address. [85 FR 85533, Dec. 29, 2020]

I recommend that you log on to the "your FCC Registration" at <u>https://apps.fcc.gov/coresWeb/updateRegistrationPre.do</u> to make sure that your email address is up to date. Also, in the future should you change your home address or your email address be sure to remember to update it on the FCC site.

[The \$35 FCC application fee applies to new, renewal, rule waiver, and modification applications that request a new vanity call sign. The fee will be per application.

Administrative updates, such as a change of name, mailing or email address, and modification applications to upgrade an amateur radio licensee's operator class or to request a sequentially issued call sign, are exempt from fees. - ed.]
