I then had my obligatory oatmeal raisin cookies (5 in all!) that Peter, N1ALO's wife made for us, and I waited at my seat to get started.

I logged into the test website and proceeded to start answering questions. Due to my study routine, the answers started jumping out at me! I went through all the questions and at the end I went back and checked my answers and made sure that I had answered all of the questions. I did not change any answers. (Never change an answer on a multiple-choice test. I learned that the hard way in college.)

I then submitted my test answers online for the VE's to grade. It was the longest 5 minutes of my life as I awaited my score. After the five minutes went by, I saw a big green box appear on my IPad that said "Congratulations, you passed! 47 out of 50 correct!" I had attained what I had thought of as unattainable. My test score was higher than any Practice Test score that I had achieved. I was on Cloud Nine!

I was also on Cloud Nine when I heard that a father and son (the son was 11 years old) had also passed the Extra Test that night. The 11-year-old is the future of our great hobby for sure. His Dad was beaming with pride as they left the exam room.

Now that I am an Amateur Extra, I want to become a VE, and administer exams to up and coming hams in the hobby, as a way of giving back to those that helped me along the way to my Amateur Extra license. I now have one more goal this year and that is to learn Morse Code. I am sure that with effort and practice, I will be able to attain that goal as well.

Here's to everyone in the Club attaining their goals and aspirations in the hobby in 2024. As I always say, we are a G.O.T.A. Club. Get out there on the air and have fun with the greatest hobby in the world!

From the Editor's Desk By Marla Wallace, WA1GSF

Last month, I printed two diagrams of my current project – a 6m crystal oscillator module that will be the signal source for an AM rig I'm making. I have gotten the oscillator / buffer stage constructed and debugged (though when this photo was taken, the 78L09 voltage regulator was still in transit, so I'd powered the board from a 9v battery). Here's what it looks like:



This is what Manhattan-style construction looks like. Everything is laid out on a rectangular grid using "islands" when connections between components need to be made (other than to ground). You can see an unused "island" near the top of the picture that will be wired up when the regulator arrives. The board is three inches square, and the "islands" are a bit under a quarter inch in diameter.

I had never done Manhattan-style construction before. I'm impressed with how nice it looks. Almost as good as a PC board and a lot easier to home-brew. But you'd better be certain about the circuit configuration because this style doesn't lend itself to breadboarding. You can change a part value easily enough, but changing where it connects is going to make a mess and adding more parts is just about impossible.

The only thing I had to do during debug was adjust the number of turns in L1 and T1. (I had mis-calculated the required turns count by about a factor of 2!) Once L1 was resonant at 50.4 MHz, the oscillator took off. The buffer stage output seems lower than it should when driving a 50-ohm resistive load, so I may need to rework T1 to improve the coupling between the windings. Also, having taken half the turns off the primary, the ratio of Zpri to Zsec is no longer 9:1 as designed, which probably isn't helping.

I've been retired for a decade now, almost. It's fun to play engineer again.

The Spring NEAR-Fest XXXV Dates Have Changed

Please note this is an updated announcement. Please disregard any other notices you may have read.

Dear Friends of NEAR-Fest:

Our Spring 2024 hamfest, NEAR-Fest XXXV, will be held on Thursday April 25th and Friday April 26th, 2024. There will be no hamfest activity on Saturday due to an unfortunate scheduling conflict with the Deerfield Fairgrounds. We had originally announced that the event would take place only on Friday but due to popular demand and the cooperation of the Deerfield Fair Association we are pleased to announce this new full two-day schedule.

Our 2024 Fall NEAR-Fest XXXVI is scheduled for October 11th and 12th and will be the same as always for the past eighteen years, (i.e.: on Friday and Saturday).

The gates will open on Thursday morning at 7:00 AM for **prepaid ticket holders only** so you might want to buy your tickets online

well in advance starting February 1st, 2024, on our Web site, <u>https://www.near-fest.com</u>, or in March at the Ham Radio Outlet store in Salem NH and at Ross Hochstrasser's Clock Shop in Whitman MA and get your favorite spot. NEAR-Fest XXXV will end at 3:00 PM on Friday.

Prepaid ticket holders will line up and enter via Gate C as we did in the Fall. They must have **all** of their needed tickets and inside parking passes or they will be sent to Gate F. This includes all Campers, RVs, tenters, who must also have their overnight camping passes as there will be NO tickets or passes sold at Gate C. Anyone needing to buy tickets or parking passes will go to Gate F and will be admitted starting at 8:00AM. Once the line has entered at Gate C it will close and all others entering the grounds will have to proceed to Gate F.

For this event only admission per person is \$10.00 whether you buy your ticket online or in advance or at the gate. Overnight parking and tent passes are \$15.00 regardless of whether you plug into an electric outlet or not. Campers, RVs and overnight stayers will go directly into the Fairgrounds as we will not be using the campgrounds this time. The cost of the pass for RVs, Campers, Motorhomes, etc, is \$30.00. All vehicles that remain in the Fairgrounds overnight (after 9:00 PM) will require an overnight parking pass in addition to an inside parking pass for Friday.

Everyone over 21 will need an admission ticket except unlicensed spouses, active-duty military, full-time students (with ID) and other valid pass holders.

If you buy something big and heavy in the flea market one of our volunteer staff members will be glad to transport it and you to your vehicle at no charge as we have been doing for many years. As always inside parking for disabled persons is free of charge and they may use a single person "mobility device" as well. NEAR-Fest reserves the right to limit the use of golf carts and "other power-driven mobility devices" due to safety concerns and potential liability issues.

Technician in a Day Study Course

Classroom Session: Saturday, April 20, 2024, 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM Sponsored by: Cape Ann Amateur Radio Association Gloucester, MA.

Our Technician in a Day Session is a study course. The course allows you to become licensed by the Federal Communications Commission as an Amateur Radio Operator.

You should first obtain a copy of the ARRL Technician Class License Manual. You may purchase this book at Ham Radio Outlet or any other amateur radio related store.

You should read the book. The information contained therein will allow you to answer questions on a 35-question test for obtaining your Technician License.

There are videos on Youtube.com at W4EEY that explain the theory and cover the questions to enhance your knowledge. You may also take practice exams at <u>https://HamStudy.org</u> for comprehension.

1. You should apply and obtain an FCC Registration Number at:

https://apps.fcc.gov/coresWeb/publicHome.do

 You will be charged a small fee for this course, \$40.00. (Normally, \$15.00* for the examination, \$15.00 for study materials and \$10.00 for snacks and drinks which will be provided for the session.)

*For minors under 18 years, the test fee is \$5.00

- 3. The Tech In a Day Session will be almost a full day session (8 am to 5pm)
 - a. The first study session begins at 9:00am for 45 minutes and you will be given a 15 minute break before the next session begins at 10 am.
 - b. Three study sessions will be held before a lunch break (approximately 11:45am-1:00pm)
 - c. There will be three more study sessions in the afternoon to run to 3:45 pm.
 - d. Testing will begin approximately at 4:00 pm.

You will be administered an examination of 35 questions of which you must score at least 26 out of 35 or better to pass.

Upon successful completion of your examination, you will be handed a Certificate of Successful Completion of Examination) (CSCE Form).

Your exam results will be forwarded to the American Radio Relay League in Newington, CT for processing to the Federal Communications Commission. When your license has been processed, you will receive an email from the FCC requesting the \$35.00 Application Fee.

Please use a computer to make this payment – tablets and cellphones will not work!

Upon receipt of your payment to the FCC, you will receive an email with instructions on how to download a copy of your new license.

Becoming an ARRL member or is your membership up for renewal?

One of the benefits of being an ARRL Affiliated Club is a commission for recruiting new ARRL members and securing timely ARRL member renewals.

Each new ARRL member earns the club a \$15.00 commission. New members are defined as never having been a member or a returning member that has not been a member for two years. Each renewal earns the club a \$5.00 commission. There is no limit to the amount a club can earn in this program.

Multiyear memberships earn only one commission. Life, Family, International, Blind, and Student memberships are not eligible for a commission. The member will not be eligible to receive a gift or incentive if the club collects a commission on the membership.

Currently at least 82 BARS members are also ARRL members. If we all renewed through the club, we could potentially receive \$410 per year from the ARRL.

If you are interested in renewing your ARRL membership through the club fill out the following form <u>ARRL Affiliated Club</u> <u>Membership Application (pdf)</u>. Then forward it to <u>W1LUS@hotmail.com</u>

Is your Email address on the FCC site up to date? § 97.23 Mailing and email addresses.

Each license grant must show the grantee's correct name, mailing address, and email address. The email address must be an address where the grantee can receive electronic correspondence. Revocation of the station license or suspension of the operator license may result when correspondence from the FCC is returned as undeliverable because the grantee failed to provide the correct email address. [85 FR 85533, Dec. 29, 2020]

I recommend that you log on to the "your FCC Registration" at <u>https://apps.fcc.gov/coresWeb/updateRegistrationPre.do</u> to make sure that your email address is up to date. Also, in the future should you change your home address, or your email address be sure to remember to update it on the FCC site.

[The \$35 FCC application fee applies to new, renewal, rule waiver, and modification applications that request a new vanity call sign. The fee will be per application.

Administrative updates, such as a change of name, mailing or email address, and modification applications to upgrade an amateur radio licensee's operator class or to request a sequentially issued call sign, are exempt from fees. – ed.]

April Get-on-the-Air Suggestions from Scott Ginsburg, K1OA

BARS is a "get-on-the-air" (GOTA) club. We encourage members to participate in the varied events on HF and VHF.

If you're a serious DXer you won't want to miss two recently announced DXpeditions to rare DX locations:

- The first is Jarvis Island located in the Pacific about 1300 nautical miles south of Hawaii, planned for the beginning of August this year. Jarvis is part of the Palmyra and Jarvis DXCC entity (KH5) and is #18 on the Clublog most wanted list with the last major operation taking place 8 years ago. The callsign will be N5J and the plan is to operate with RIBs (Radio in a Box). Because of this the operation will not count for IOTA.
- The second is Glorioso Island (FT/G) located in the Indian Ocean near Madagascar, planned for May 24 to June 19 of this year. This will be a 1-man operation by FH4VVK who will also be there for a work assignment and the callsign will be FT4GL. Glorioso was last activated 15 years ago and is #7 on the Clublog most wanted list.
